

Why Regional Transit?

Regional transit will open the door to jobs, education, and mobility independence for millions by connecting Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties.

Investing in better transit will improve our quality of life, generate economic development, and strengthen our region – building a stronger and more competitive economy for all of us.



To get you where you need to go quickly and efficiently, with faster and more frequent service.

Ø RELIABLE

To get you where you need to go on time, while providing more hours of service during the day and on nights and weekends.

Ø REGIONAL

To get you to the places you want and need to go throughout Southeast Michigan via a seamless, coordinated system – whether it's to work, home, school, shopping, or entertainment.

What Will It Cost?

The RTA is asking for a 1.2 regional transit millage to fund regional transit in Southeast Michigan. This \$1.20 property tax for every \$1,000 of taxable value of a home equals an average of

The funds raised from the regional transit millage will bring over \$1 billion of additional funding to Southeast Michigan.²

Our Region is Not Connected



- Many people rely on transit to move around Southeast Michigan.
- Gaps in our transit system make traveling throughout the region difficult or impossible.
- Those who rely on the transit system can't easily get to where they want and need to go.

Connect Our Communities



- The RTA will coordinate with AAATA, DDOT, SMART, and the People Mover. Existing service from these providers will remain.
- New services will create a regional system crossing county borders to efficiently get people where they want and need to go.

Fill the Remaining Gaps



- Expanded paratransit will provide door-to-door service for those who need it and offer a consistent level of service throughout the region.
- Flexible transit services will connect residents in the outer parts of the region to the transit network.

Improving Access to Jobs



26% of Detroit households do not own a car.3



40% of commuters cross county and city borders to get to work.⁴



92% of jobs are not accessible within a 60 minute trip on transit.5





We Need Rapid, Reliable, Regional Transit

Southeast Michigan lacks a true regional transit system. Existing transit services are underfunded, uncoordinated, and too often do not get people to the places they need and want to go.

The **Regional Master Transit Plan** can change that. Investing in regional transit will:

- Connect people to jobs, retail, education, healthcare, and entertainment reliably and efficiently
- · Empower those unable to drive to travel independently
- Boost our economy by attracting and retaining businesses, employers, and talented individuals

What Will it Cost?

To make **rapid**, **reliable**, **regional** transit a reality, voters in Southeast Michigan will be asked to consider a **1.2 mill** property tax increase on November 8, 2016.
